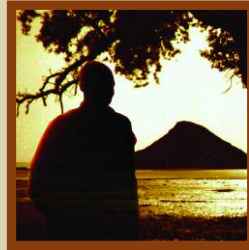

The editors have assembled distinguished Eritrean scholars and professionals, each capable of addressing an aspect of Eritrean tradition from the writer's particular field of expertise. While the methodology and style of analysis have been left to the judgment of each contributor to use the best practices prevailing in their respective fields, each was asked to provide a cogent analytic description of the tradition in question, exposing its essential elements, and to address the implications of those elements to the long-term development of the country.

The book is intended to serve two related purposes: first, to document and analyze selected traditional legacies and cultural practices in Eritrea, and second, to establish the linkage of those legacies and practices to Eritrea's current and prospective socio-economic developmental goals. Readers should thus be able to gain a comprehensive picture of how the traditional practices may influence social and economic development in Eritrea. The book is aimed at an interdisciplinary and general audience interested in Eritrea's tradition and its relevance to development issues and concerns.
